Words and Images of Advent

Advent is a time to prepare and make ready. Being aware takes a lot of energy and thoughtfulness. The endurance of many weeks produces hope for the joyful expectation that is near and getting closer each day in Christmas. I find Advent preparation is a reward in itself. Living in the present moment with care can be lifegiving and transformative that shows in our posture when the day of celebration arrives.

I love how songs help us prepare... to go to sleep, to worship, to receive a gift (Happy Birthday), to celebrate Christmas, and much more. Here is a little background on this year's Advent song, ELW #593 "Drawn to the Light." It is written and composed by John Ylvisaker, a prominent contemporary Lutheran composer and musician who was born in Moorhead, MN and graduated from Concordia College. The first verse is based on Isaiah 9:1-4, "the people who walked in darkness have seen a great light." The second verse is from 2Peter 1:19, "pay attention to it, as to a light shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts." The third verse is from Revelation 21:22-26, "The city doesn't need the sun or moon to shine on it, for the glory of God gives it light, and the Lamb is the lamp." The tune name is "LaCrosse" because it was premiered at a WELCA Conference held in La Crosse, WI.

Images can be powerful in conveying a message too. The collaborative community art project of coloring pieces that will come together to form large images of Advent and Christmas has been a holy experiment this year that started with, "what if..." Now we see them take shape and represent our wonderful community who colored in faith that they were part of something bigger. This panel of art announces of the birth of the Christ child saying, "Joy to the world..." A child has been born, hurray! This is the light of God we have waited for.

Bringing music and images together in a Christmas Pageant shares the story of Jesus birth in an impactful way during worship. This year, with capacity limits in place for safety during a pandemic, we lament that we will not have over 100 kids singing and sharing the story with families packed into our new church building. We are working on pulling together the pieces to have a Virtual Christmas Pageant this year. We are stretching and learning new ways technology can be used in this time to creatively gather people's stories and contributions into a story we recognize for celebrating the birth of Jesus, which is the true reason for this season that brings hope to an anxious world. Hear the good news of great joy, Do Not Be Afraid, for a savior is born, Jesus Christ our Lord.


Coloring Pages



COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

October 12, 2020 (Zoom)

Meeting called to order by Broc Lietz. Present: Wendy Mensing, Melissa Grommesh, Todd Erickson, Broc Lietz, Scott Kost, Jerome Crandall, Pastor Walka, Pastor Jacobson, Stacy Link Opening Devotions led by Pastor Walka.

Secretary Report-Minutes from Sept. 14, 2020 were reviewed with no changes requested. Wendy made a motion to approve the minutes. Melissa seconded the motion, motion passed.

Financial Report-Scott noted that giving was down in Sept. He does not want to read too much into at this time. We will see how things will look in October. All our balances still look incredibly good. Expenditures are also down. Motion to approve the Financial report was made by Wendy. Todd seconded the motion, motion passed. Todd made a motion to pay the October bills. Jerome seconded the motion, motion passed.

Committee Reports

Worship/Media-Jerome has no major news. He has asked volunteers to step back into their Usher roles if they feel comfortable doing so.

Education-Pastor Walka reported that Sunday School starts on Sunday, the 18th. There will be a meeting with the possible teachers tomorrow the 13th to go over the curriculum and the process of how the classes should be done and the color system.

Property-Todd said that Lakeside needs to bring fill in so that compaction tests can be done. Gateway has been to the building and took pictures and measurements to give us a quote on the ice breakers.

Social Outreach and Ministry-Wendy said there is no social ministry happening right now.

Fellowship and Support Committee-Two people have signed up for yard clean up. Melissa has contacted one of the two and will call the other this week. There will be no Giving Tree this year per First Link. Pastor Mike gave Melissa a letter from YWCA about the Grace Garden apartments for moms with kids. Maybe we could fill an apartment for a family.

Old Business

Building Project Update

Punchlist Update/Final Bill-Enterprise has sent us a final bill. Enterprise would like to start charging a finance charge. Roughly \$78,000 is being held back because the punch list is still not finished. Pastor Mike sent out the punch list with the items noted that are finished and ones that are not. Pastor Mike suggested another walk through with Enterprise to explain that there are still many items that have not been corrected from the punch list. The council wants to come up with a dollar amount that could be released from the held back amount after that walk through. The council is asking the staff to coordinate a meeting with Enterprise to go through the church.

Snow Retention-Waiting on the quotes from Gateway.

Council Positions/Committees (Melissa)-Melissa asked if there were changes that people see that need to be made on the committee portfolios. Broc asked Melissa if she feels there should be an Executive Committee? Pastor Mike pointed out that the committee document is going to be a work in progress.

2020-21 Budget-Reminder if you have any budgetary concerns for the budget please bring them to Pastor Mike by Nov. 15 so that the Executive members can work on the budget for December approval.

Janitorial Position-Wendy has been cleaning the church with some volunteer help. She feels that an average

would be 12-15 hours without the Education wing and Fellowship hall.

New Business

Medical Plan-The council needs to choose which medical plan the church pays for in 2021. The Gold plan increases \$74.00 for next year but the Retiree support has been removed from Portico bill. Scott made a motion to continue with the Gold plan. Jerome seconded the motion. Motion carries.

Property Insurance-If we pay multiple payments at once we can save finance charges. Wendy made a motion to make the remaining two payments for 2020 and Scott seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Building Finalization-We are at a point of finishing the church atmosphere.

Interior Design Committee-Broc asked if anyone would like to be a liaison to an Interior Design committee. Stacy would be interested in doing that position.

Entry Rugs-We received a quote from Aramark for \$54.00 every 2 weeks or \$43.00 every week for rugs in the entry by the doors. They will also take our dirty mop heads when they pick up the rugs and give us clean ones. Scott makes a motion to go with Aramark for entry rugs and mop heads. Melissa seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Bell Placement-Broc asked what the council would like to do with the bell. Todd suggests having it outside on the west side, 10ft in the air and to have an electronic switch to ring it. If a foundation needs to be poured it should be before the final landscaping is done. Todd will get a quote for this project.

Storage Shed-Someone has come forward to purchase a mower and someone else has offered to pay for a storage shed. Todd feels we would be able to find volunteers to mow more easily than finding volunteers for snow blowing.

Pastor's Report and Remarks-Pastor Keith just returned from a trip to NC. He listened to the Transformed Christian Education, Confirmation has started, visits and phone calls with church members, a graveside service, and a funeral today. He has been reporting the music we use to CCLI. Boundaries classes are coming up.

Pastor Mike has been involved with weddings, funerals, confirmation, Bible studies, and hospital visits. He ordered an online class, attended the Transformed event, and is working with Moore Engineering. Men of Martin's is coming up, and he will be ordering books for the new Bible study he is starting up. There has been a request for a Baptism for a grandchild of a church member. The council approves. A non-member requested using Martin's for a wedding. Council does not approve the request.

Joan asked the council what they would like to do with the Memorial placards. Stacy will take care of them.

The Devotions were led by Pastor Mike.

The Governor has changed Cass County to Orange and has mandated 25% occupancy or no more than 50 people to gather. The change leads to the question about Sunday services and Sunday School and other events.

Day to Day Operations-Pastor Mike recommends following the Governor's order of a maximum of 50 people in the church and all wear masks including the staff. The council feels this would be the right decision to follow.

Sunday Service-Broc asked if we should go back to collecting names before the Sunday service to ensure the 50-person maximum? Wendy recommended using Sign-up Genius to keep track of the number attending. The staff was asked to contact the people we know of that are not using email or Facebook to get them signed up.

Sunday School-Stacy thinks we should not do Sunday School in person and recommends moving to a virtual program. Scott feels it is prudent to postpone live Sunday School classes. Stacy and Pastor Keith will create a plan for virtual classes.

Special Events-There was to be seven confirmands to participate in the Confirmation ceremony and one that was going to have a private service due to family health concerns. Should we still have Confirmation with limited guests or postpone the service? The council felt the families should be allowed to give input on the options and then a decision made after that.

Quilters-The council felt it was fine to allow the Quilters to continue coming as long as they wear masks when not eating or drinking.

Funny Things Are Everywhere by Charles Hoffacker

There's an interesting quote - from an unexpected source - that applies to this First Day of Advent, from a book you may have read to your children or grandchildren, or that you may remember from your own childhood. The book is by Dr. Seuss, and is entitled 'One Fish, Two Fish, Red Fish, Blue Fish.' The quote to consider today is brief:

From there to here, from here to there, funny things are everywhere.

Funny things are everywhere! And there are two things funny about this First Sunday of Advent, the start of a new church year. The first of them is that, here at the start of a new year, we don't look back to the beginning, but we look forward to the end. Here on the first day of the new church year, we do not focus on the past, but we anticipate the future where Christ promises to meet us.

The second funny thing about today is related to the first. When we look forward to the end, when we anticipate the future, we do not treat this conclusion as some distant, far-off event. It is near at hand. It may be as close as the next second. So imminent is it, in fact, that the future comes and takes up residence in the present. The Christ who will arrive with power and great glory at the end of time comes to us also before the end of time.
